


Schedule for accepting Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship students recommended by the Embassy



***1** If an applicant applies to the Japanese Embassy and passes the first screening, the applicant will send a set of application documents to the International Office of KU. The International Office will contact the prospective supervisor via the Student Support Section by e-mail to decide whether to accept the student.

Note: In rare cases, the applicant may contact the faculty member directly.
Please inform the Student Support Section (rixgksien@jimu.kyushu-u.ac.jp) if you are contacted.

Prospective supervisors must consider the acceptance or non-acceptance of the applicant thoroughly based on the application documents (research plan, transcripts, etc.) and the online interview, etc.

The applicant will be asked to complete a Letter of Acceptance if accepted. The Student Support Section will send the Letter of Acceptance to the applicant.

***The Student Support Section will handle the entrance management procedures for international students, but we will ask their prospective supervisor for necessary information, etc.*

***2** At this point, since the candidates have not passed the graduate school entrance examination, the prospective supervisors will accept them as "research students" or "Japanese-language preparatory students. The prospective supervisors should discuss the student status of the candidates at KU in April or October and the subsequent regular course entrance examination timing with the candidate. Instruct candidates (students) to apply for and take the graduate school entrance examinations appropriate for their time of admission.

◆ *Japanese-language preparatory student*
The candidates enroll in the International Student Center at KU and take Japanese preparatory courses (Japanese language and culture) for six months after arriving in Japan. Those with sufficient Japanese language proficiency and those whose prospective supervisor does not deem it necessary for them to take preparatory courses are not required to take the course.

In case of taking the examination after coming to Japan, we will accept the student as a "non-regular" student.


Apply for and take the graduate school entrance examination appropriate to the regular program!

Period of MEXT scholarships

Those who have been a research student for two years or less, including Japanese language preparatory courses, and who will enter a higher education within the scholarship period are eligible to apply for an extension of the period of the MEXT scholarship.

(*Example: Research student to Master's/Doctoral course, Master's course to Doctoral course, etc.)

Please discuss the extension request with the student and instruct the student to submit the required documents by the deadline to be announced by the Student Support Section.

The scholarship period for regular programs is the number of years of study (Master's: 2 years, Doctoral: 3 years). The period cannot be extended for reasons of retention.
